
So let us go boldly into this year, trusting in God's presence among us as we engage in the work that God gives us to do.

**The election for congregation council will take place on Sunday, October 25 throughout the morning.**



## *Moving Forward Together for St. Philip*



### **STEWARDSHIP, YOU, AND THE PONY EXPRESS**

We are all optimistic about the potential of St. Philip as we move forward together. We are engaged in identifying our unique SHAPE both as individual partners in ministry and as a faith community. Exploring our assets led to a variety of new initiatives within the congregation as well as the expansion of other ministries. God is doing some amazing things in our midst as we continue to grow in faith and reach out to others in God's name.

Moving forward together to become the congregation that we are called to be means fully funding our ministry spending plan for 2015 and 2016.

This year, the Responding and Finance teams are initiating a process that will involve every household in the congregation based on the old Pony Express relay system. The plan is to have 18 "Trail Bosses" who will coordinate the passing of a saddle bag along a route that includes giving cards and envelopes for 8 to 10 households.

Each saddlebag will contain a list of the members on the route, addresses, telephone numbers and a giving card & envelope. The first name on the list will receive the saddlebag, read the stewardship summary in the saddlebag, take their giving card from one side of the saddlebag, complete the estimate and place the card in an envelope, seal it and place on the other side of the saddlebag. The saddlebag will then be delivered to the next name on the list, etc., etc., until all names on the list are contacted and each family is given the opportunity to fill out and submit their giving card. The last name on the list delivers the saddle bag back to the church office or to their Trail Boss for return to the church office.

Expediency is key here. We are encouraging all to partake, but the saddlebags should move quickly along the route. In addition to giving an estimate of giving for 2016, every household will have the opportunity to give an additional financial gift in support of our 2015 ministries. Together we can fully fund our ministries for 2015 and determine the extent that ministries will be funded in 2016.

The "Trail Boss" is always available to assist and answer questions. We only ask that you quickly fill out your giving card and deliver the bag to the next name on the list. The saddle bag itself will contain simple, detailed instructions. In this way every member will be involved.


Those who have some mobility concerns, are shut-in, or live away from the congregation will have the opportunity to participate in the ride with the help of the US Mail! They will receive the same information as everyone else and be given the opportunity to complete an estimate of giving card.

Each and every one of us will "own" part of the process as we move forward together to support the ministries of St. Philip. This whole-church approach will shorten the drive and increase response among members, allowing fellowship to grow as the saddle bag is passed from one to the other. You will be able to make your decision about giving to God through St. Philip in the privacy of your home without another member of the church present to solicit your response. You will be able to meet your St. Philip friends as you pass the bag to your neighboring congregation members.

The Pony Express will begin at both services on October 18 when the "Trail Bosses" will be introduced to the congregation. The Pony Express will conclude at one 10:00 AM service on November 22 and be followed by a chuck wagon luncheon in Luther Hall. Over the next month, we will be explaining the details of the ride. For now, we simply ask everyone to saddle up and join the entire congregation on this new and exciting pony express ride.

Hi, my name is Trey Thompson and I'm going to be telling you about the Crop Hunger Walk. The Crop Walk started in 1980. It was for children and families who were living in poverty. With donations every year Urban Ministries would give families food, a source of water, and sometimes shelter. In thirty-five years the Crop Hunger Walk has raised over \$2 million.

Imagine you live in Kenya. To get to fresh water you have to walk at least 5 miles. Once you get there you fill your five gallon Jerry, which weighs 42lbs. Then you have to walk back with it balanced on your head. What I just described to you is what a family has to do every day just to survive in Kenya.

For \$12 you can provide 200 micronutrient packets for malnourished children. \$30 can drill one meter of a shallow borehole well - providing safe water for a whole community. Any donations are helpful.

Please come to the End Hunger Now Crop Walk. It will be held at **Broughton High School, Sunday, October 25**. Get there at 3 pm for registration and for some very fun activities. The Walk itself begins at 4 pm. It is a 5k route. For all the kids coming be sure to wear your Halloween costume. There will be a prize for the most creative costume. For all the adults coming you can or don't have to but there is a Flashback to the 80's clothes. I hope to see most of you there!

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## All Saints Day Celebration – Sunday, Nov. 1, 2015

On All Saints Day we celebrate the victory won for all the faithful dead in Christ's life, death, and resurrection. All Saints' Day provides a time for us to remember, reflect on and thank God for our loved ones who have died. While we celebrate God's victory over death, we continue to grieve for our beloved dead knowing that God honors our tears.

Beginning on Oct 11, a Book of Remembrance will be at the Welcome Center for you to record the names of those who have died since the last All Saints Sunday. These names will be read during worship on Nov. 1<sup>st</sup>.







## Building Independence - Lutherans are Building Homes, Communities, and Hope

Building Independence is a partnership between Habitat for Humanity of Wake County, Lutheran Services Carolinas (LSC), and The Serving Cup with the Lutheran Coalition of congregations in Wake County and Thrivent Financial.



The Building Independence project will build and maintain affordable housing for 9 low-income adults with intellectual and/or developmental disabilities in three adjacent Wake county homes. The homes will be built at 2610 Lake Wheeler Road.

Most of the Lutheran churches in Wake County have set a goal to raise \$7500 for this project. St. Philip has contributed \$1000 so far. We've entered late into the fund raising phase of this project and have fallen short in our financial support.

Construction will begin around November 5. Work days will be held on Thursday, Friday, and Saturdays beginning at 8am and ending at 3:30pm.
