Weekend —September 8th & 9th — This is an opportunity to celebrate who we are as the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America —one church freed in Christ to serve and love our neighbor. The weekend starts on Saturday morning at 10:00 am with our Brown Bag Ministry packing & delivering lunches to the residents at Cedar Point. Then on Sunday, we will begin the celebration with one combined hour of worship at 10:00 am. Following the service we will pack 1,052 meals through the Rise Against Hunger program!

Here are some points to know for this event:

- ◆ Goal for number of meals: 10,152
- Goal for number of volunteers: 50, there are tasks for everyone.

- Howard and Kathy Cunningham are coordinating: contact them if you can help with setup
