Our Phase 2 objective will be a process to review Acts Bible lessons over the next several weeks during the Sunday School hour, between services in Kepley Hall. This will provide a common foundation to prepare us collectively for re-imagining what God's call for St. Philip is. It is a time to reflect individually on the lessons of Acts and God's purpose for us, have open eyes, ears, minds and hearts, share conversation and allow ALL to be heard, and build new relationships.

Last week we kicked off the first Coffee and Conversation session at 10am in Kepley Hall. For our first session of 2019, our Nurturing Relationships small group ministry team led 46 members in small groups through the first 2 chapters of Acts....great turnout! Due to the tight time constraint between services, beginning today, we have revamped the agenda to cover only one chapter of Acts to allow for more time for relationship building by exploring the Scripture in a deeper and meaningful way.

Please plan to join us on Sunday mornings morning from 10-10:45am in Kepley Hall for the Coffee and Conversation session. We will break into small groups to discuss this week's key lesson which is **Acts 7:54-8:40**. The Nurturing Team leaders will also bring Acts 2 back into focus as all the groups weren't able to complete that last week.
