Developing a Closer Relationship with God through Prayer, Caring Conversations, and Faith Sharing

Lent will be a very unique time for our congregation. It'll be unique because we will actually immerse ourselves in a spiritual journey before Lent officially begins. It'll be unique because rather than giving up some random thing, we'll intentionally focus on the spiritual practices of prayer, caring conversations, and sharing our faith.

The resource we'll use is called *Unbinding the Heart* by Martha Grace Reese. Martha writes that this is all about "untying the knots that keep us from living exciting lives in the Spirit. It's about unbinding the Good News that God adores us and everyone else, that God has shown this to us through Jesus Christ" (p. 3 of *Unbinding Your Heart*). Every one of us needs to hear this Good News time and time again!

Prayer is an important aspect of *Unbinding the Heart*. Prayer is the way we stay in love with God. Prayer is the way individuals, small groups, and congregations grow and become vivid. Prayer involves effort, habit, and focus; but it results in lightness and energy and excitement. Through this study you'll be invited to try a variety of prayer practices in hopes that you'll discover new ways to deepen your prayer life.

To help us make room in our busy lives for this intentional time, many of the committee and other small group meetings will take a break from meeting during the season of Lent (late January – Easter Sunday). By

removing these meetings and activities we'll create the space that we need to intentionally focus on developing a closer relationship with God and each other. Be sure to check with your committee and small group leader to see how this sabbatical from meetings will impact your group. This will probably challenge us a little bit but it'll be worth it as we nurture our relationships with each other and center our faith community life on God.

We'll immerse ourselves in Unbinding Your Heart. Small groups will be offered at a variety of times during the week in order to include as many people as possible. Sunday school for adults, youth, and children will incorporate a study of the concepts related to Unbinding Your Heart. Worship will include a preaching series and the hymns we sing and the music we hear will be related to this experience.

We encourage everyone to participate in this unique encounter with God by signing up to be part of a small group, reading the book, doing the prayer exercises, and attending worship. Registration materials will be available on December 6th.

My brothers and sisters, give yourself a gift this Christmas and sign up to participate fully in this intentional time of developing a closer relationship with God and each other through prayer, caring conversations, and faith sharing!

Overview of Unbinding Your Heart

Unbinding Your Heart (UYH) is a nine-week whole congregation study of prayer and faith sharing. The book includes 40-days of individual prayer exercises coordinated with each chapter and a personal prayer journal.

Purpose

Enrich the faith community; Develop and deepen our relationship with God; Provide opportunities to practice a variety of ways to pray; and Teach us how to talk about our faith.

The Vision

Imagine all of us reading the same book, trying out different approaches to prayer, and reflecting on the experience every day.

Imagine gathering together in small groups to share insights from what we're reading, to talk about how God is showing up in our lives, and to pray together.

Dates

Whole congregation study: begins in mid-January 2016 and ends the week of March 13, 2016; Sign up: December 6, 2015 - January 10, 2016.

Activities

Daily reading, prayer and journaling activities; Weekly small group meetings; and Full integration with Sunday morning worship including hymns, readings, and preaching.

Small Groups

Facilitators of the small groups will be members of the congregation who have worked through the study already. The facilitator's role is to help the group establish a safe and open environment for conversation and prayer. They will convene the group, manage time, and keep the group focused on the topic.

Small Group Meeting Times

Monday mornings from 10 - 11:15 am Monday evenings from 6:30 – 7:45 pm Wednesday evenings from 6:30 - 7:45 pm Other times as needed to involve every member of the congregation.

Unbinding Your Heart - FAQs

Is Unbinding Your Heart really about "evangelism"?

Yes and no. No, it isn't the 'evangelism' most of us have come to associate with this word. It isn't about pressuring people about God. It isn't about increasing our church's membership. It isn't about putting a new coat of paint on an old building.

Rather, it's about taking our faith seriously. Yes, it is about experiencing a genuine connection to the One who created us. It's about re-kindling our love for God and one another. And finally – it's about what naturally springs from experiencing a deeper relationship with God which is the desire to tell others – in plain words, who God is and what God has done in your life.

Why is Unbinding Your Heart important?

Our world is full of people, many of them right outside our doors, who need to hear the very message we sometimes take for granted. It is important because not only do we need to be revitalized in our own walk with God – but because there are others who desperately need God's healing and wholeness in their lives and we may be the very ones God is calling to help make that happen. Our church will certainly be blessed by Unbinding Your Heart – but more importantly, you will be blessed personally – and YOU are where it all begins.

Will I have to do a lot of reading?

After a week of getting to know each other in your small group, you will read one chapter for each of the following seven weeks – easily read in one sitting, but better enjoyed over the course of each week. The last session, in week nine, is a time for the group to enjoy fellowship and conversation about the entire experience.

What are the requirements for participation?

The level of your participation is entirely up to you. Each Sunday morning will be a culmination of the reading and devotional time of the week leading up to it – but a person will not have to have read the book or participated in a small group in order to enjoy or be inspired by our worship.

For those who choose to participate fully, the things I believe need to be present include: an open and willing heart, mind spirit; a copy of Unbinding Your Heart; participation in a small group; and daily prayers and devotions (provided in the book).

How will children and youth participate in this study?

Youth who desire to may sign up to participate in a small group with adults. Children and youth will also engage in this study on Wednesday nights and during Sunday School on Sunday mornings.

Is there a cost to participating in the congregationwide study of Unbinding Your Heart?

The cost of the books pre-purchased by our church is approximately \$10 per copy. We are asking for a donation of \$10 to help cover this cost – understanding there will be some who cannot afford this expense and some who can cover the expense of books for themselves and many others. Book payments will be collected when you register. Please make checks payable to St. Philip and note UYH on the memo line. If you're able to donate additional funds that will help cover the cost of the books for those who are unable to purchase a book for themselves, it would be greatly appreciated. Regardless of one's financial position, we encourage every member to take a copy of Unbinding Your Heart.

Multiple people in my household are participating in the study, do we each need to purchase a book?

Because the book includes the 40 days of prayer and journaling, you're encouraged to purchase a book for each member of your household who is participating.

Can I be in the same small group as my family members?

When you register, you'll have the opportunity to indicate the type of small group that you prefer. Some may be single gender groups while others may be mixed gendered. Some may include couples or family groups while others may be comprised of singles. Some may include people from various generations while others may include people from the same generation. Be sure to indicate your preference on the registration form.

Will there be a variety of opportunities for me to be in a small group?

Yes. Small groups will be meeting at different times during the week. You will have the opportunity to sign up beginning on December 6. Indicate the group meeting time that will work best for you. If none of the options are convenient, suggest another time and we'll see what we can do to organize a group for that time. Once you start in a small group, we ask that you to stick with that group rather than switch between groups in order to establish a small group community.



Did you know...

WIC and Food Stamp programs do not cover diapers.

Diapers can cost a family \$100 month per child.



1 in 3 parents has had to choose between buying diapers and food.

Without diapers babies cannot attend daycare or participate in early childhood education.

Those of you who have built relationships with the folks we serve through Brown Bag Ministry and Abundance Ministry know that diapers are a big deal to the families we serve! The good news is that we have partnered with The Diaper Train to supply diapers on a monthly basis! Together we can do something tangible for families that are struggling at the moment! Going GREEN At St. Philip (New Contribution Envelopes Coming)

We have all thrown away pink envelopes at one time or another. I know I have. Did you realize that as a congregation we are actually throwing away around 8,600 envelopes a year. Each of those envelopes is being sent at a cost of around 10 cents per envelope. I know that 10 cents doesn't sound like a lot, but we are basically throwing away around \$860 a year. Think of the wonderful things we can do at St. Philip with \$860. That is a lot of **GREEN** we can use towards our various ministries.

With the current process we are using through Cathedral we have no choice but to send each contributor a weekly envelope plus special observances each year regardless of what you use. We will be implementing a new process where you will receive what you need. If you need 52 envelopes a year, 12 envelopes a year, 10 at a time, or no envelopes we will be able to tailor the program so each person gets just what they request.

Freed in Christ: Race, Ethnicity and Culture

IN A NUTSHELL

The Evangelical Lutheran Church in America (ELCA) teaches that there is one God and one humanity created by God, as expressed in Scripture. Our oneness in Christ, the one who breaks down dividing walls, connects all people. The whole church looks forward to God's future when people will come from everywhere to eat together in the reign of God (Luke 13:29).

This church names racism as sin and affirms that the diversity of cultures throughout history is a God-given gift and a glimpse of the future. Plurality of culture (the attitudes and patterns of life) is a blessing to be appreciated, not absorbed by assimilation. The ELCA opposes discrimination, supports legislation that guarantees equal rights, and promotes international respect for human rights.

AIMS OF THIS 3 WEEK GUIDED DISCUSSION

- To utilize this statement as a tool to guide conversations on race relations, ethnicity, and culture; and what it means to be a public church that values all people.
- To confront the cost of narrowness, racism, and exclusivity with repentance and appreciate and celebrate the benefits of racial and cultural diversity in the Church.
- To seek ways to help the congregation commit to a celebration of racial and cultural diversity, a valuing of all people and an action on behalf of and in support of social justice for all.


