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Harry Potter and Evangelism

Now, that might seem like an unlikely pairing to you, but it really isn't and here's why.

In the Harry Potter movies, there was a main character whose name was rarely spoken, instead he was referred to as "You-Know-Who" or "He-Who-Must-Not-Be-Named." The character was so mean, evil really, that no one would speak his name for fear of death. This fear gave Voldemort so much control and power. It wasn't until Harry grew up and developed his powers to confront this evil that the man's name was finally spoken and then defeated.

The word "evangelism" seems to generate that same kind of fear in us. Within the church it's "the-word-which-must-not-bespoken" or "the-action-which-must-not-be-taken." While the word itself means "good news," it's associated with the practice of telling others about Jesus. The image that often comes to mind when we think about evangelism is of street Evangelists yelling at people as they pass by about the judgment to come or TV Evangelists who use fear to convince people that they need a personal relationship with Jesus.

All of this causes us to avoid evangelism for fear of being like those other evangelists, or that our words will offend someone, or worry that we don't know enough about the Bible, or anxiety that we won't have the right answer to someone's question or the right response when someone challenges our faith. You see, we have a lot of baggage with this word!

Harry Potter and Evangelism (continued)

In *Unbinding Your Heart* we get a new definition of evangelism. The author, Martha Grace Reese, defines evangelism as "faith sharing." It's not at all about convincing someone to become a Christian or bombarding someone with words of judgment about their own faith or the lack thereof.

Instead evangelism is all about sharing the impact of our faith within the relationships we have and the people we encounter each day. It's about naming the source of our faith, the source of our peace, the source of our joy, and the source of comfort in our lives.

In 1 Peter 3:15 (NIV), we read "Always be prepared to give an answer to everyone who asks you to give the reason for the hope that you have. But do this with gentleness and respect." Our study of *Unbinding Your Heart* will immerse us in the safety of a small group of people so that we can practice speaking about the reason for the hope that is ours every day. Through this experience, we'll deepen our relationships with God and each other as we meet together weekly for prayer and caring conversations.

My hope and prayer is that you'll participate in this transformative experience for both you and the congregation!

The What and Why of Unbinding Your Heart

The What...our whole-congregation study of *Unbinding Your Heart* is about "untying the knots that keep us from living exciting lives" ... with God and with each other. "It's about unbinding the Good News that God adores us and everyone else, that God has shown this to us through Jesus Christ."* It's also a prayer journal with many forms of classic Christian prayer included in the daily prayers that accompany the study.

Untying and unbinding...so often we find ourselves knotted up with doubt, anxiety, and worry. These emotions can spur us to ask questions and seek solutions <u>or</u> they can paralyze us and keep us from living joyfully in the Good News that God loves us completely. By becoming more fully aware of God's presence in our every days lives and by becoming more comfortable speaking about our faith with others the knots that bind our hearts will be untangled.

The Why...people in churches across the country are excited about what is happening in their congregations through the study of *Unbinding Your Heart*: deeper relationships with God, a rich, meaningful personal prayer life, and a new sense of God's activity in their lives. People are saying they can be more 'real' with others as their relationship with God grows ... and that this extends to relationships within their families and with people in every area of their lives.

This extraordinary experience will transform us as individuals and as a congregation. As each one of us becomes more excited about God's relationship and presence in our lives, St. Philip will become a more exciting faith community where the Good News of God's love is made known through vibrant worship, engaging faith formation, joyful fellowship, and generous outreach and care of our neighbors.

What are small groups and why should I participate in one?

It is sometimes very difficult to get to know people in a congregation the size of St. Philip especially since we have 3 worship services. The reality is that worship isn't really conducive to helping us get to know each other. Because of the way the worship space is configured we sit facing front and looking at the back of the heads in front of us. Apart from the Sharing of the Peace, we rarely have the opportunity to interact with each other.

Committee meetings are a little better because we gather together around a common table and make eye contact with each other. The challenge with committee meetings is that we become so task focused that we really don't spend time hearing each other's stories. Together we may do what needs to be done but we really don't deepen our relationships with God and each other.

The small groups formed during our experience with Unbinding Your Heart will offer the relational setting in which we can get to know each more fully. We'll make connections with each other that will expand beyond the small group gatherings transforming small group members and the congregation at large.

Small groups help us get close enough to know each other, to care and share, to challenge and support, to laugh and weep together, to be accountable to each other, to watch over each other and to grow together.

Small groups are most effective when a loving and comfortable environment is established. Group members need to feel safe in the groups so that they can participate more fully. Some tips that will enhance our small groups and make the experience more meaningful to you and others:

- Small groups will be limited to no more than 8 people so that everyone has the opportunity to participate.
- Select a small group time that best fits in your schedule so that you can consistently attend the meetings.
- Avoid switching between groups. The presence of a new person in a group can upset the dynamics of the group.
- Make every effort to attend your group each week so that you don't miss anything. The groups will have conversations each week that will be difficult to reproduce.

Be sure to indicate your preference for a small group when you complete the sign-up form.




