Do Not Worry

There are plenty of things for us to worry about in this world, plenty of things for us to fear. Stressors seem to pop up everywhere. Here we see Jesus teaching about many things that cause angst – needless worrying, waiting, divisions, disputes, and much more! These teachings linger on, much like our anxiety. But thankfully, God is greater than our worries and greater than our fears. God's very being creates peace and comfort. Yet when we look around, that's sometimes terribly difficult to see! Our society is messy, and finding the good is often tough. Yet, at the heart of this chapter we hear Jesus's voice calling us: "Do not be afraid, little flock." We, the flock, sometimes feel feeble, barely hanging on, bogged down by our fears and worries. We find ourselves scattered, lost, and in need of God's herding.

Maybe that's why Jesus tells us "do not be afraid/fear" twice in this chapter and "do not worry" four times in this chapter. That's six exhortations from Jesus. Six times Jesus urges us towards peace and comfort. Six times we receive reassurance from Jesus. Jesus cares for the holistic well-being of his people...and perhaps we need to hear that again and again.

To Ponder:

- At this current moment, right now, what do you see as messy in your life?
- How is God calling you to find peace and comfort in this midst of this chaos?

Let us pray. Nurturing God, we boldly pray that you will meet us in the midst of our fears and anxieties. Guide us, your flock, towards you life-giving peace that we seek. Amen.

Financial Report for May 2016

May resulted in a net loss of \$4,817 against a budgeted gain of \$1,725. This worse than expected performance is due to both general fund and other income giving being under what was expected. Expenses were \$3,005 lower than expected which helped to offset the impact of lower overall giving.

Year-to-date we have a net loss of \$1,808 against a budgeted gain of \$5,143. General fund giving is \$3,128 over what is planned which helps reduce the impact of lower than expected other income giving. Expenses continue to be lower than expected. It is important that we be attentive to our giving patterns and not fall further behind during the summer months.

Ever Thought about Becoming a Stephen Minister?

Stephen Ministry is a lay care giving ministry. This ministry is grounded in Jesus' command to love one another. Through one-to-one caring and confidential relationships, those who are hurting receive the love and care they need to support them.

Training to serve as a Stephen Minister is a wonderful opportunity for you to grow in faith, develop stronger relational skills, and bring Christ's love into the lives of hurting people.

As you prayerfully consider your participation in this ministry, it is important for you to know that:

A Stephen Minister is NOT:

A Stephen Minister is:

- A counselor or therapist;
- A problem-solver;
- A casual visitor.

- A child of God who walks beside a hurting person;
 A caring Christian friend who really listens;
- A lay person who has received 50 hours of training in how
 - to provide distinctively Christian care.

Stephen Ministers work alongside our pastor to care, encourage, and provide emotional and spiritual support to people who are going through a difficult time, such as divorce, grief, hospitalization, unemployment, terminal illness, relocation, chronic illness, or loneliness.

If you have gifts for caring, encouragement, and listening, please prayerfully consider whether you might want to be part of this exciting ministry.

Frequently Asked Questions about Stephen Ministry

- Question: How much time will serving as a Stephen Minister involve?
- Answer: After the initial training, the time commitment as a Stephen Minister includes one visit (approximately one hour) per week with the person receiving care from you. Also after the initial training, Stephen Ministers are expected to attend two meetings per month for supervision, support and ongoing continuing education.



Question: What is the cost of becoming a Stephen Minister?

Answer: The total cost for training each Stephen Minister is \$50. This includes two training workbooks, 3 books, and other associated costs.

Dedication Service Scheduled for Building Independence Lake Wheeler

Lutheran Services Carolinas (LSC) is excited to announce the anticipated opening of Building Independence Lake Wheeler – three homes that will serve nine low-income adults with intellectual and/or developmental disabilities.



To celebrate the completion of this project, LSC is hosting a dedication service and open house scheduled for <u>Sunday, August 21 at 4:00 p.m.</u> The service will be held on the grounds of the homes located at 2610 Lake Wheeler Road in Raleigh and will feature special speakers and fellowship with the organizations, donors, and volunteers who made this project possible. A barbecue, sponsored by Thrivent Financial, will take place following the service.

Each energy efficient home includes three private bedrooms and bathrooms, and common kitchen, living, and dining space. LSC will operate the homes, which will include offering services that empower residents on their journey to independence. Residents will benefit from affordable monthly rents, access to public transportation and shopping, life skills coaching, opportunities for paid jobs and vocational training, and continuous encouragement from LSC staff.

The project was initiated as a collaboration between The Serving Cup, Habitat for Humanity of Wake County, and LSC. Other Building Independence partners include the North Carolina Housing Finance Agency, Wake County Lutheran congregations, Thrivent Financial, Wheat Ridge Ministries, and many other generous individuals and organizations.
