# Observations at the Half-Way Point


This has been a really fun and inspiring season of worship! Many thanks to the Worship and Music Team, the Congregation Council, Marcia Klinder-Badgley, all of the various musicians and worship leaders, the Fellowship team, and all of you for joining together in worship this summer! We still have about 6 weeks to go on the summer worship schedule and some great worship services ahead of us.

At this half way point, here are some observations from my vantage point:

- We can be flexible and innovative when we need to be. We've needed to adjust the worship space
  each week to accommodate more worshippers. We've had to think creatively to overcome some
  obstacles. Hopefully by the end of this season we'll have it all figured out!
  This builds up the Body of Christ!
- Worshippers are making new friends and reconnecting with those they don't see often. Combining three services into one has challenged us in some ways but seeing the excitement of people when they reconnect with friends and make new ones is worth it! This builds up the Body of Christ!
- We sing and pray louder when we sit closer together. There's something about hearing the voices of others that gives us the courage to sing out and to participate more fully boldly in worship. This builds up the Body of Christ!
- Being closer to the pastor and worship leaders, the musicians, and the altar causes us to be more engaged in worship. Making eye contact, smiling, and closing the great divide between where worshippers sit and where worship leadership happens strengthens our relationships with God and with one another. This builds up the Body of Christ!
- People linger around for a longer period of time after worship when refreshments are available. Being able to grab a snack and a drink immediately after worship and in the same place as worship has given people the opportunity to visit for a while. This builds up the Body of Christ!

I invite you to pay special attention to what's happening in and around you during worship over these next 6 weeks of worship. I'd enjoy hearing some of your observations.

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# **Welcoming Vicar Molly**

The time is fast approaching when Vicar Molly will begin her year of internship at St. Philip. Her first Sunday is August 7 and her first day in the office is August 8.

### What does the word "vicar" mean?

According to the definition in the Meriam-Webster dictionary, a "vicar" is someone serving as a substitute or agent. In the ELCA, the term "vicar" applies to someone who is a candidate for ordained ministry serving under the supervision of a pastor in an internship. During her year of internship, Vicar Molly serves under the authority of Pastor Pam.

# Why is it important to address the intern with the title "Vicar"?

As someone preparing for ordained ministry, Vicar Molly needs to get used to being addressed by a title. This helps her live into her role as vicar and soon to be pastor. Just as referring to the pastor by title, using the title of vicar helps the congregation remember that she is among us in a unique role.

### What will Vicar Molly be doing at St. Philip?

It is expected that the intern will participate in every aspect of congregational life. This is a full-time position and will include one day off each week. Vicar Molly will preach, assist in worship, lead Bible study, teach classes, visit the sick and the homebound, attend committee and council meetings, plan worship, support ministries, and engage different aspects of parish administration.

### What does it mean to be an internship congregation?

Being an internship congregation is a wonderful gift to the entire Church. Without internship congregations, the ELCA would not be able to prepare future pastors. Serving as an internship congregation requires us to make room for the intern to continuing discerning God's call and gifts for ministry. During the internship year, Vicar Molly will observe, reflect, and try on a variety of roles. Vicar Molly has completed two years of seminary and is still learning what it means to serve as a pastor in God's church.

### What are the financial considerations of being an internship congregation?

The congregation is responsible for paying a monthly stipend, providing housing and all the expenses that go with that, paying tuition to the seminary to maintain her status as a student, and paying for a couple of continuing education experiences. As always, regular and generous financial giving by everyone in the faith community is necessary throughout the year to support the spending plan of St. Philip. If you wish to make a contribution over and beyond your usual giving to support this new ministry, please note "internship" on the memo line. A generous donor has promised to match gifts given to the internship fund up to \$4,000.

### What can individual members do to support Vicar Molly?

Wear your name tag. Introduce yourself to her until she can call you by name first. Be open to receiving care from her. Be loving in your communication with her. Encourage her efforts. Answer her questions. Listen as she shares her observations. Participate in classes and other activities that she plans. Affirm her gifts for ministry.

# A Friendly Welcome for Vicar Molly

To help Vicar Molly get settled and her Pantry stocked we are going to have a St Philip version of an old fashioned "Pounding". What is a Pounding you ask??? A "pounding" is the gift of groceries and other household items for someone setting up their home. It is an old custom whose name probably comes from the time that general stores sold most items by the pound.

Vicar Molly will be joining us on August 7. Donation baskets are set up outside of Luther Hall for "pantry items" for Vicar Molly since she will be coming without many items of that sort.

So you can reach in your pantry and grab an item or pick up something during your weekly shopping trip.

The recommended items are broken down below:

### If your last name begins with:

- A-G.... Rice, pasta, oatmeal, pasta sauces
- H-M....Canned veggies, fruit and tomato products
- N-R.....Cereal (all varieties), canned soups, canned/boxed broths, small canned ham
- **S-Z**......Paper products (napkins, paper towels, toilet paper) and cleaning products

care. Training topics include: listening, using Christian resources to provide care, maintaining boundaries in caregiving, confidentiality, ministering to those experiencing grief, and many more.



# Dedication Service for Building Independence Lake Wheeler on August 21st

Lutheran Services Carolinas (LSC) is excited to announce the opening of Building Independence Lake Wheeler – three homes that will serve nine low-income adults with intellectual and/or developmental disabilities. To celebrate the opening, LSC is hosting a dedication worship service and open house scheduled for <u>Sunday</u>, <u>August 21 at 4:00 p.m.</u> The service will be held on the grounds of the homes located at 2610 Lake Wheeler Road in Raleigh and will feature special speakers and fellowship with the organizations, donors, and volunteers who made this project possible. A barbecue, sponsored by Thrivent Financial, will take place following the service.



Each energy efficient home includes three private bedrooms and bathrooms, and common kitchen, living, and dining space.
LSC will operate the homes, which will include offering services that empower residents on their journey to independence. Residents will benefit from affordable monthly rents, access to public transportation and shopping, life skills coaching, opportunities for paid jobs and vocational training, and continuous encouragement from LSC staff.

The project was initiated as a collaboration between The Serving Cup, Habitat for Humanity of Wake County, and LSC. Other Building Independence partners include the North Carolina Housing Finance Agency, Wake County Lutheran congregations, Thrivent Financial, Wheat Ridge Ministries, and many other generous individuals and organizations.
