Adult Sunday School—Beginning TODAY September 22nd at 10:10:

In Luther Hall the Faith Formation class will use 7 sessions of *Animate Faith* for study. In each *Animate: Faith* session, the group will watch a video featuring a leading voice from the Christian faith, spend time on personal reflection and share ideas with the group.

In the Library the Augsburg Class will be focused on Responding to God's Grace. This topical Bible study will use texts from Genesis, Exodus, Luke, 2 Corinthians, and more to inform one's faith and discipleship in daily life.
