Pastor's Message

October is a big month for us here at St. Philip. First off, we will be seeking nominations for new Church Council members. Our President Mike Davis and Vice-President Dawn Kanupp have served us faithfully and will be stepping down at the end of the year. Mark Andrews, Wayland Smedley, Kathy Blum, & Kelsey Weinzapfel also have terms that are expiring. We thank them all for their commitment and service. They have helped guide us during a tumultuous time in our congregation and world (due primarily to the Covid-19 pandemic). They are to be thanked and celebrated.

We are seeking nominations to replace these people. The deadline for nominees is Sun., Oct. 17. Please give some thought and prayer to whom you might like to see serve in this capacity of leadership – whether yourself or someone else. We will then vote on our slate of nominees two weeks later, on Sun., Oct. 31. We are very excited to see whom God would have lead us on Church Council during the new year.

Secondly, October is always Stewardship Month for us here at St. Philip. It is the month when we prayerfully reflect on how good God has been to us this past year, both individually and collectively. Our God is a God of bounty and abundance, and He has blessed us richly in 2021. This year has been the best year for us financially in many years. And it happened during a time when – due to the challenges of the pandemic, particularly as they effected worship – things could very easily have taken a downturn.

We have had several repeat visitors since we reopened in-person worship in June, and many of them may become members once we offer our New Member Class (currently in the works). Much of our in-person ministry is resuming, including Bible Study, the Choir & Handbell Choir, and Brown Bag Ministry. Our on-line presence is significant and growing, in terms of worship, Bible Study, and committee meetings.

We have navigated the transition to an online presence, if not seamlessly, extremely well – given the expertise and commitment of many of our members and helpful additions to our technological capacities.

We have gotten a new roof, a resealed parking lot, a new altar in Kepley Hall, and renovations in that same space. We are soon to acquire a new pulpit in Kepley Hall and likely new kneeling cushions for the altar rail in our sanctuary. Most of all, people are coming to Christ and growing in their faith and wisdom here in this place. There is a spirit of generosity and a sizable momentum taking place.

We are called to respond in only two ways: thanksgiving/gratitude and commitment. So, this month, we are thankful and grateful. And we recommit ourselves. We will have three weeks' worth of Temple Talks/personal testimonies by individuals reflecting on the ways God has blessed them – which will inspire and motivate us. And then we will celebrate together the goodness of God on "Celebration Sunday," Oct. 24, at our 9am and 11am worship services. At this time, we will be asking you to submit your financial pledge cards, so we may begin to faithfully prepare for a new year here at St. Philip. I have every reason to believe we will capitalize on our recent momentum.

Will you join me in giving thanks and praise to God for a PHENOMENAL and unanticipated year of ministry -- and increasing your offering above last year's? I know I am most excited to do so.

Finally, we rejoice in the Confirmation of several of our youth: Ashlyn Adams, Emma Faircloth, Avery Grantham, Nyah Schroeder, and Kelsey Weinzapfel will be affirming for themselves the faith and promises made by their parents at their baptisms as infants. What a privilege it is to behold our young people embracing the Christian faith we all hold so dear and central to our lives. These youths will also become full members of our congregation, with all the rights and privileges therein. They will be confirmed on Reformation Sunday, Oct. 31, at the 9am and 11am worship services. The color for the day will be red, as red is the color of fire, a biblical symbol of the Holy Spirit. And, as we celebrate the Protestant Reformation and the Confirmation of our young people, the Holy Spirit will be front and center that day.




It is time for us to re-emerge and begin participating again in all the things that make St. Philip a powerfully positive force for Christ in our community.



Message from the Finance Committee

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

After our income being under budget in both May and June, we had very strong financial results in July and August. Total income in each of the last two months was the highest for July and August for at least the last five years. Our congregation responded once again, as led by the Holy Spirit!

For August, total income was \$56,304, or \$11,659 over plan, while expenses were \$34,275, or \$7,384 better than plan. In addition, we had a substantial one-time other income item not included in those numbers. The SBA PPP loan in the amount of \$71,882 was formally forgiven under the terms of the special pandemic loan program. The forgiven loan amount is now shown as income on our books. It did not result in any new cash for the church at this time since we received the cash in 2020 when we got the loan.

Year-to-date through the first eight months, our income was \$416,797, or \$57,068 above plan. Expenses totaled \$317,996 and were \$50,302 under plan. For the year, income exceeded expenses by \$98,802. When the income from the loan forgiveness noted above is considered, income has exceeded expenses by \$170,684.

The Lord has blessed us mightily at St. Philip! The generosity of God's children in our midst is at the forefront of those blessings!

Our Impact

As you might imagine, we have been busy at Families Together pushing ahead on several fronts to assist local families facing the compounded challenges of being homeless in a pandemic. In the program year ending June 30th, Families Together with your generous support:

Served 478 children and 239 adults for a total of 717 individuals in 196 families.

Of that number, we helped 88 families obtain permanent housing and provided short-term housing for 23 families.

Since launching our Affordable Housing initiative in 2019, we have built a portfolio of 21 units that are owned and/or managed by FT which includes our recently purchased Duplex and Triplex off of Athens Drive.

Cottage Court Development

We continue to move forward with plans to build cottage court homes on land adjacent to the duplex purchased by Families Together in east Raleigh in 2020. A cottage court is a group of small houses that face inward on a common open green space making it ideal for families with children. Our next step is to hold a series of stakeholder planning sessions with clients/former clients, developers, architects, staff, board, and other stakeholders to create a shared community vision for the cottage court development. With this input and the guidance of our development team, we will create a blueprint, site plan, and architectural design for a replicable cottage court model.
