Happy New Year! I pray you are open to receiving all the blessings God has in store for you in 2022. Our God is faithful, and we always take comfort in that.

We are most excited to be offering a "New Members' Class" on Saturday, January 29th, from 10 am to 12 pm, here at church. Help spread the word! This meeting will be held immediately following worship. God has been especially good to us as of late, and so we recommit our lives to Him in this new year.

From all of us at Families Together, we wish you a very Merry Christmas and a Happy New Year!!





a recap and thank you...

This year the Stewardship Committee's theme has been **Open Hearts**, **Helping Hands**, expanding on St. Philip's mission statement – **Sharing the Love of Christ**.

- ♦ Focusing on how God has enriched our lives, opened our hearts and made our faith stronger.
- ♦ With a desire to bring attention to your generosity in supporting our annual ministry plan and at the same time enhancing each of our own individual giving plans.

Through this past year we carefully came back to in person worship and continued to stream all of our worship services. We have reached people who were not connected to St. Philip before this pandemic. To do so we continued to fine-tune the process and quality by purchasing additional equipment and licensing to stream services to the public. Fortunately, St. Philip's expenses were less than what we planned for, and gratefully generous gifts, beyond pledges, were given to St. Philip which gave opportunities room to adapt our technology.

We were also able to use these gifts to get some much needed work done on the property. A couple of the projects done were a new roof, upgraded 2 restrooms to be fully accessible, with one set up for Families, and more. The leadership of the Property Team, & Finance Committee is to be commended for strategizing the use of the funds in improvements of our church property.

With the continuing challenges and uncertainties for 2022, we are grateful for your generosity and appreciate the financial commitment you made to St. Philip. We hope that more of us are getting closer to tithing – 10% of either our gross or net income. That's a huge challenge by itself. We pray to God and hope that with his love and guidance that more of us will reach our tithing amounts.

God is always with us during prosperity or struggling at the bottom. He was watching over Mary and Joseph at the end of their long journey with no place to stay, and the innkeeper offered a stable for comfort and safety. God wants us to prosper and gives us many blessings – you can probably think of one or two now. Do not expect the next bombshell to fall. Expect the next blessing to come. One of our biggest blessings is St. Philip – our place to worship for spiritual growth, a sanctuary for comfort and peace, a circle of friends that is growing as we reach out to serve and connect - a place to belong.

We know you do not need us to remind you that the ongoing ministry of St. Philip depends to a great extent on regular financial support. We appreciate the many ways you have continued to enable that ministry and pray for you to receive the strength you need to navigate through these difficult and sometimes scary times.
