


Adult Book Club





Message from Finance

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ.

On behalf of the Finance Committee, I am pleased to report that our financial results bounced back positively in February and, as a result, we are back on track from a budget perspective.

In February, total income was \$61,423 for the month, or \$13,715 above plan, while expenses were \$45,270, or \$135 under plan. On a year-to-date basis, total income was \$94,550, or just \$866 under plan, while expenses were \$86,050, or \$10,579 under plan. Income exceeded expenses by \$8,500.

So as noted above, we are where we need to be at this early point in the year. Please continue your generous support of our ministries at St. Philip so we can grow in our calling to serve our Lord and His people.
