Pastor's Message

A very blessed Easter season is upon us, and I pray for healing, peace, and joy in your life as you read this.

Due to a last minute stroke of luck, the three of them are able to escape formation and hide in the woods for days before being rescued.

And this is where the story begins. From there, the three sisters travel to Israel, to their new home, but the battle for freedom takes on new forms. Livia, Magda, and Cibi must face the ghosts of their past-and some secrets that they have kept from each other--to find true peace and happiness.

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

On behalf of the Finance Committee, I am pleased to report that we enjoyed another strong monthly performance in March and 2022 is off to a good start.

In March, total income was \$61,800 for the month, or \$12,343 above plan, while expenses were \$40,641, or \$4,764 under plan. On a year-to-date basis, total income was \$156,350, or \$11,477 above plan, while expenses were \$126,691, or \$15,342 under plan. Income exceeded expenses by \$29,659.

Our Gracious Father continues to bless us richly at St. Philip and the Holy Spirit has given each of you a most generous heart.
