## Pastor's Message

We are most excited this month to welcome Kai Thurow as our new Outreach and Youth Ministry Coordinator! He comes to us highly recommended, with years of meaningful experience. We are excited to welcome his family as well: wife, Lauren, daughter Kaden, and son Cameron. Kai will bring many gifts, a strong passion, and fresh eyes for our vision here at St. Philip. His first Sunday with us will be this coming Sunday, September 4. We invite you to come out and meet him and his family! If you are able, we are greeting him with a "pounding" -- that is, with a "pound" of food (sugar, flour, etc.) or other necessary items (paper towels, toilet tissue, diapers -- Cameron is 10 months old). You may also purchase gift cards (grocery, gas, restaurants, Home Depot, etc.).

We will officially install Kai the following Sunday, September 11, at our combined 10 am worship service for "God's Work/Our Hands Sunday."

The timing of Kai's arrival was perfect for us. Back when Cathryn Hewett announced her retirement, she aimed for August 31<sup>st</sup> of this year; we prayed we could get a quality candidate who would begin on or around September 1<sup>st</sup>. We look forward to fellowshiping with one another as we serve our neighbors in need that day. Bible study resumes this fall on Wednesday, September 14. Morning Bible study will be at 10:30 am, and G.R.O.W. ("Get Renewed on Wednesdays") will be at 6:45 pm. We will begin with Acts, chapter 14, that day and continue throughout the remainder of that book through next spring. We eagerly invite everyone to study God's Word with us this year. We anticipate a great fall season here at St. Philip!

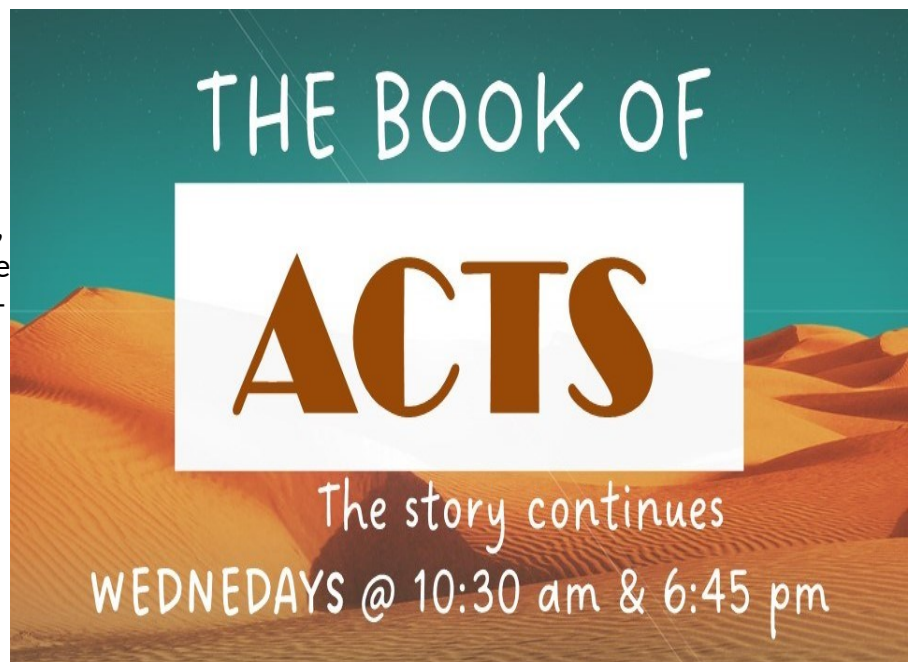
## Pastor's Bible Study

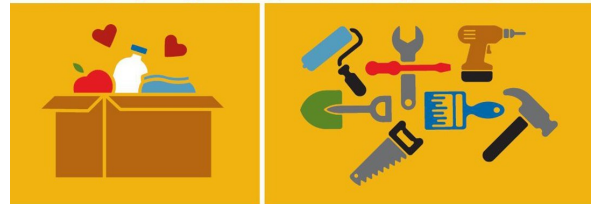
And Abigail Lowery, who has built a life based on security and self-control, is at risk of losing both.

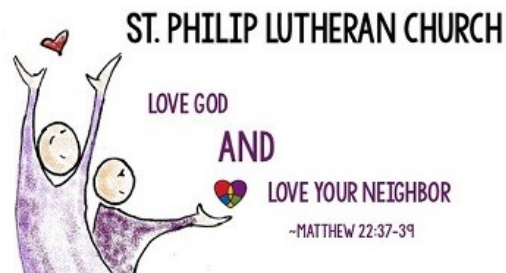
We believe each child is unique and special so the curriculum is based on the premise that children learn in a variety of ways, at different speeds and with different experiential backgrounds provided by their parents.

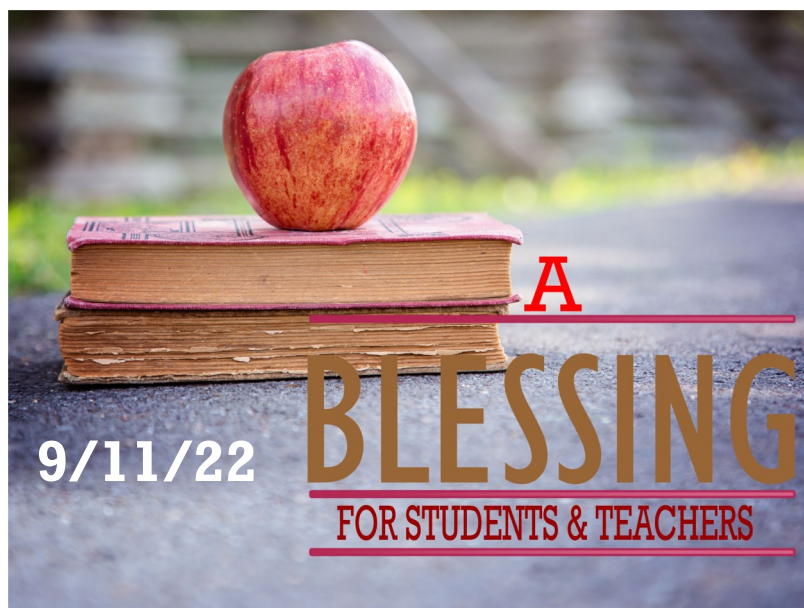
To my St. Philip family,

## Expanding in Response to Our Community's Need for Housing

The July rent report from Rent.com shows a staggering 48.9% increase in the cost of a two-bedroom apartment in Raleigh compared to the same time last year. Extremely low-income families are disproportionately impacted by these soaring costs and the Families Together team has been growing its response. A large grant from Wake County, along with funding from the spring campaign and other generous support, has enabled Families Together to add four new full-time positions and one part-time position to our Housing Programs team.

**New funding** enables Families Together to enhance and expand our housing and support services. It also covers the cost of 15 motel rooms that will be integrated into the Families Together Emergency Shelter program. This will help fill an urgent community need for non-congregant shelter, which allows families at risk of separation to remain together while they obtain permanent housing.

Over a 12-month period, our high-level goals are to provide Emergency Shelter for 40 families and to help 85 families (including those in our Emergency Shelter program and partner family shelters) transition from homelessness to home with the specialized, holistic support of the Families Together team.

## New Volunteer and Outreach Coordinator

We're excited to announce that Sara Karbley is the new Families Together Volunteer and Outreach Coordinator. As Sara gets acclimated in her new role, she'll be reaching out to our partners and connecting individuals and groups to opportunities to get involved with Families Together.

# Message from Stewardship

*We've been thinking.....*

**We were all given the same Spirit to drink. <sup>14</sup> So the body is not made up of just one part. It has many parts. 1 Corinthians 13-14**

Much of the world relies on the selfless work of a single bee. Nearly all plants would not exist without the pollinating efforts of bees. The beehive consists of countless bees selflessly working together to achieve a common purpose. In addition to the endless creation of food from pollination, the pollen is returned to the hive to feed. The byproducts of their works produce products like honey and wax, which are used and consumed to sustain life and in countless products. Life would cease without the devotion of bees. Oh, how we are thankful for this magnificent creation of God.

Much like bees the Christian faith relies on pollination (stewardship) through “sharing the love of Christ” to thrive and grow.

The work of bees (stewards) is selfless, but vital to not only the ability of the hive (the body of Christ) to grow, but also vital to health of the surrounding ecosystem (community).

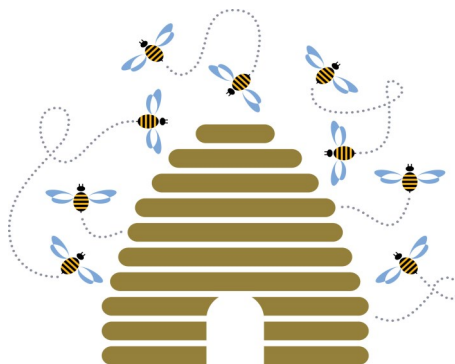
The devotion of our bees (stewards) to our hive (congregation) and ecosystem (community) is an important part of doing God’s work and sharing the love of Christ.

Our ability to come together to achieve a common purpose is a magnificent work of God.

Bees live in a cooperative way described as “eusociality,” or good relations. Each bee contributes a specific skill to the colony, synchronizing its efforts for the benefit of all. Likewise, a church’s health depends on all members fulfilling their responsibility to the organism as a whole. Descriptions of hive life mirror Paul’s words about the body of Christ, with members having different gifts “but the same Spirit” (1 Corinthians 12:4).

According to R.S. Beal Jr., who was both a pastor and a zoology professor, a beehive is the perfect “living illustration of how to walk in unity.” He wrote, “Those of us who have believed in Jesus belong to one another just as much as we belong to Christ. We cannot live independently of one another anymore than we can live independently of Christ. Like the bees, we must learn to practice the sacrifice, labor, sharing, and submission of love that together we ‘may grow up into him in all things, which is the head, even Christ’” (Ephesians 4:15, KJV). How are you using your own spiritual gifts to build up your church “hive”?

Through sharing the love of Christ, we pollinate our hive (congregation) and our surrounding ecosystem (community). The benefits of our pollinating efforts (stewardship) can be seen and felt throughout both. The fruits of our labor are endless, and the byproducts (honey, wax) are crucial to feeding (both literally and figuratively) to our hive (congregation) and ecosystem (community). It helps create and maintain a diverse and healthy ecosystem (community) so that all may enjoy the love of Christ. Through our selfless work towards sharing the love of Christ, we will truly enter the land of milk and honey and receive the bounty of God’s love.

# Message from Finance Committee

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

After June being on budget for income and under budget on expenses, July was well under plan on income. A good portion of the amount under plan is attributable to Sunday falling on the 31<sup>st</sup> and the income from that Sunday not being accounted for until the following month. However, some of the shortfall is due to our summer vacation slowdown. So, please remember to make contributions online when you cannot be present.

In July, total income was \$30,763 for the month, or \$16,945 under plan, while expenses were \$47,297, or \$3,107 under plan. On a year-to-date basis, total income was \$316,759, or \$18,946 under plan, while expenses were \$306,280, or \$33,571 under plan. Income exceeded expenses by \$10,478. Please bear in mind that while we are under plan on expenses, we don't account for budgeted reserves until December.

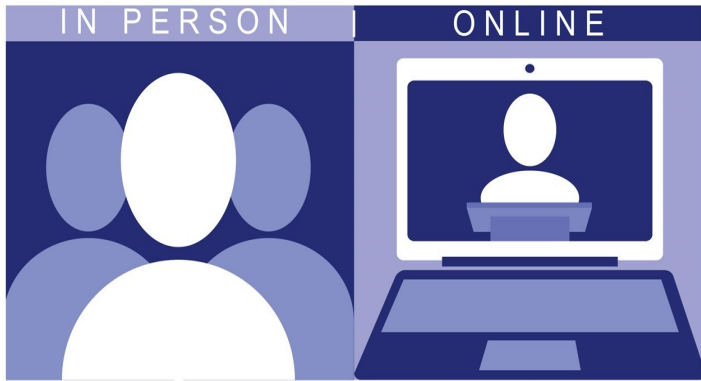

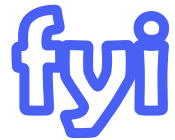
