The items on the agenda for this meeting are the approval of the 2023 Budget and the approval of the Land Sale.






## Lutheran World Relief Quilting Group


## An Evening with the Bishop

## Message from Finance Committee

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

We are pleased to provide this update on our financial progress.

Total income for October was \$44,896 for the month, or \$2,812 under plan, while expenses were \$49,526, or \$878 under plan. On a year-to-date basis, total income was \$441,482, or \$39,096 under plan, while expenses were \$437,846 or \$43,218 under plan. Income exceeded expenses by just \$3,636, and expenses do not reflect budgeted reserves, which are not expensed until the end of the year.

While income improved in October compared to the previous month, it still fell a bit short of plan. In order for us to meet the financial plan that was approved by the Congregation last December, we'll need giving to increase measurably in November and December. We typically do see higher giving in the last two months of the year but, without that, we may not be able to fund budgeted reserves. Let's all prayerfully consider how each of us can help in some way to bring in the additional \$40,000 - \$50,000 needed to meet plan and keep all our ministries healthy. Yes, it's a big number, but by pulling together we can get it done!
