Pastor's Message

Do you remember the old cliché about this month, that "March comes in like a lion and goes out like a lamb?" Oh, how that used to be true in my youth and young adulthood! It's been a while since I've either heard that phrase or experienced it to be true. With warming temperatures all over, I'm not even sure February "comes in like a lion and goes out like a lamb."

We are currently in the season of Lent. I hope and pray that you have a meaningful 40 day season of introspection, reflection, and repentance. I have already begun turning off my car radio as I drive (so that I drive in silence) and turning on my TV at home much less (so that I have fewer distractions and background noise and more quiet time). It's a change already from the norm, that's for sure. I hope also that you have picked up your Lenten devotional booklet, "Water and Spirit," which offers you a brief Scripture, reflection, and prayer for each day. The Scriptures are all from John's Gospel.

One could say, during this Lenten season of spring, that Jesus "came in like a lion and went out like a lamb." Our Sunday Gospel lessons will present Jesus teaching spiritual rebirth to Nicodemus, a member of the Jewish Sanhedrin (high council), revealing his identity as Messiah to a Samaritan woman by a well, healing a man born blind, and – finally – raising Lazarus from the dead. He is increasingly performing deeds of power. He is a lion – the Lion of the tribe of Judah, as the Bible refers to him. Then comes Palm Sunday, when he enters Jerusalem on the back of a donkey, humbly – not exactly riding a chariot in a display of regal power.

Then, on Friday, he will die on a cross, outside the city gates. He is a lamb – the Lamb of God, who takes away the sin of the world. Much like March used to, Jesus "comes in like a lion and goes out like a lamb."

May you experience both the powerful lion (of healing and transformation) and the meek lamb (of humility and peace) this Lenten season. We follow Jesus, this season and always.





Sharing the love of Christ at St. Philip...... a churchwide Lenten journey




Augsburg Sunday School Class

Our next meeting will be on March 28th at 10:00 in the Parlor—


We will be discussing The Plot by Jean Hanff Korelitz.



City Council Members visit Families Together:

On February 14th, Families Together leadership welcomed two new Raleigh City Council members for a tour of Families Together. We thank Council Member Jane Harrison, from District D, and Council Member Christina Jones, from District E, for taking time to visit with our team and learn firsthand about the urgent need for housing and homeless services for the growing number of families with children experiencing homelessness in our community.

Some of the alarming statistics we shared: A recent study shows that it takes the income of four people working full-time minimum wage jobs to cover monthly rent in our city. In January 2023, Raleigh had the highest rate of increase in rental prices in the nation. And in all of Wake County, 45% of renters are cost burdened because they pay more than 30% of income on housing.

We applaud the commitment of these City Council Members and others on Council to address our community's housing crisis and stand ready to partner with them on our mutual goals to improve housing affordability and make our community better for all.

Message from Finance Committee

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

On behalf of the Finance Committee, here is our first report of the new year. Because of your faithful and generous giving and God's provision last year, we begin 2023 in a sound financial position.

Through January, our income was \$51,454, or \$4,014 above plan, while expenses were \$46,975, or \$10,767 below plan. Expenses exceeded income by \$4,479.

The income number for January gives us a very nice start to the year and expenses were well under plan because we were able to use dedicated funds for an air conditioning unit replacement rather than it being a current expense.

Thank you for all you do! Please continue your generous support of our ministries at St. Philip so we can grow in our calling to serve our Lord and His people. Blessings,
