Pastor's Message

We have much to celebrate here at St. Philip as of late. We concluded our Big School Supply Drive, in which we received over 4,500 individual items to donate to children in need for this new school year, almost doubling our original goal of 2,400 items. On behalf of the hundreds of children you have helped, thank you so much for your generosity! Ed Helmey just published the third and final volume of his biography, Life As I Remember It. What an achievement! Please congratulate Ed when you see him and feel free to purchase his books. From a quick perusal, they look like very compelling reads. Kurt Saenger-Heyl will be ordained as a minister of Word and Sacrament in the ELCA on Saturday, September 2, in New Haven, CT. He is called as the pastor of Trinity Lutheran Church in Centerbrook, CT. We rejoice with him and his family at this momentous occasion. Congratulations, Kurt!

Our average worship attendance greatly increased throughout the summer, which is practically unheard of for most churches. We averaged 121 people in June, 138 in July, and 142 in August. We praise God for this increase, which is in part due to an influx of visitors. Almost all of them remark to me in the receiving line after worship how warm, welcoming, and hospitable they have found our community to be. So, thank you for taking your worship life seriously and welcoming others into the presence of the Lord here in this place.

We are so excited to announce that Regan Wang has accepted the offer to be our new, full-time Director of Worship and Music Ministries!

Welcome, Regan! She has worked for us part-time in our Traditional service for a few years and has now accepted this full-time position with responsibilities for both Crossing and Traditional services. She has been and will continue to be a great blessing and asset to our congregation.

Looking forward, we wish to continue and capitalize on our recent momentum in a few ways. The first is our upcoming "God's Work/Our Hands Sunday," on September 10. We will have ONE United worship service that day at 10 am, followed by a light lunch in Luther Hall, and various service projects to take us through the early afternoon. This is always a day of worship, fun, fellowship, and service, so please plan on coming out and participating. Please see Kai Thurow for more details. The second thing to mention is that we encourage you all to buy one or two non-perishable food items when you go to the grocery store, as we are beginning to prepare once again to assist North Raleigh Ministries (NRM) in their upcoming fall food drive. We were so generous last year, and we want to build off that. Please also see Kai if you have more questions.

And, finally, weekly Bible Study resumes on Wednesday, September 13, at 10:30 am and 6:45 pm, in the Music Room. The topic this year is "The Basics of the Christian Faith." How much do we really know and understand about our faith? We are going to delve deeply into God's Word as we study together such topics as the 10 Commandments, the eight Beatitudes, The Lord's Prayer, prayer more generally and broadly, Creeds of belief (e.g., the Apostles' and Nicene), Baptism, Holy Communion, the organization of Scripture, Christian theology and history, worship, the Great Commandment,

the Great Commission, the Holy Spirit, faith, tithing/stewardship, preaching, sabbath, healing, justice, transformation, and music. In fact, this may be a two-year study!

We are growing in numbers, service, commitment, and outreach here. I want to make sure we also grow in wisdom, understanding, knowledge, and discipleship. This year's weekly Bible Study will be a fantastic arena in which to do just that. I think you will find this study compelling and even fascinating. Please prayerfully consider attending Bible Study this year, especially if you haven't in years past. It will be an enriching journey.




Augsburg Sunday School Class





Check out our Young Worship Tool Kits! These Worship Tool Kits are designed to help children to engage in different parts of worship more fully.


Each kit will have some quiet items in them with symbols on them that will match symbols in our bulletins or on our worship slides.

Our 2023 Stewardship theme is Rooted in Love... Blooming in Outreach

They are like trees planted by streams of water, which yield their fruit in the season. *Psalm 1:3*

"Rooted in Love" draws inspiration from Psalm 1. The Psalms invite us to imagine all the good things we can bear when well planted. What might we give away when we are rooted in love?

But the Psalms also meant something deeper. The word we translate as "planted" in English means "transplanted" in Hebrew.

This translation speaks to the power of love to move us from one place to another, the power to convert us from one way of life to another. What would need to change in our lives for us to be fully rooted in love?

We might need to make a move from a *mindset of scarcity* to a *mindset of abundance*. A scarcity mindset makes us think there will never be enough. But a mindset of abundance sees the fullness of God's love. God's spirit moves through history creating and renewing community.

We are not animals passing from stream to stream. We are the tree, fixed in the riverside. Our roots running deep and wide, nourished by the waters and nutrients of God's mercy and love.

Outreach Updates

St. Philip is committed to addressing the needs of our community. The two greatest and growing needs in North Raleigh and Wake County right now are 1) Growing Food Insecurity, and 2) Growing Home Insecurity. As a faith family striving to share the love of Christ, we have partnered with three local non-profits who are doing amazing front-line work helping to address these growing needs in our community. Successful School Supply Drive! Thank you!

For the month of July, we collected school supplies to help benefit children in our community that are served by our three major ministry partners, Families Together + Brown Bag Ministries/Refugee Hope Partners + North Raleigh Ministries. Each organization had a list of items that they needed us to get totaling 2,460 total items. We met each item collection goal and surpassed many of them. In total we donated 4,660 school items!









Each organization was incredibly grateful to receive the items we collected. In total our collections went to help an estimated 140+ children in our community!















St. Philip Fall Food Drive for North Raleigh Ministries starts in October

Last October our St. Philip Pub Ministry spearheaded a Food Drive that benefited the Food Bank at North Raleigh Ministries (NRM), and we're going to do it again! Last year we had a tremendous response from the congregation that helped keep folks from being hungry in our community.

October is one of the months of the greatest need for food pantries across the country as many food collection drives happen in November and December to coincide with major upcoming holidays. This leaves the month of October as one of the hardest months to keep shelves stocked.

The NRM Food Bank servers around 750 people every month, and they expect that number to continue to grow as food Insecurity in our area continues to rise. 

Ministry Partner Update: Families Together



Our partner ministry at Families Together is doing amazing things! Here's a quick update:

As the need for both affordable housing and emergency housing for families continues to rise in Wake County, Families Together has been expanding their support to those in need. St. Philip is committed to walking alongside Families Together in their mission to make sure that every child has a home.

Recently, some big things have been happening!

- ★ A new Bridge Housing Triplex Apartment complex is being renovated right now with families expected to be able to move in in November.
- ★ Families Together has been able to triple their family shelter capacity to help meet the growing need.
- ★ An HVAC unit at one of their Emergency Shelters was repaired after it unexpectedly quit working. Because of donations from supporters (including many from St. Philip) they were able to raise the necessary funds to quickly get these units replaced so families could live comfortably during our recent heat wave.

Did you know?

"Bridge Housing" is often for families living in motels and referred by the school system. Families live for 3-18 months in units owned or leased by FT and work toward housing goals while paying a modest program fee that allows them to save money and "graduate" to permanent housing.


Message from Regan Wang-

Message from Finance Committee

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

I am pleased to report on behalf of the Finance Committee that following our strong results in June, we did even better in July.

For the month, total income was \$71,079 or \$23,640 over plan, and expenses were \$47,277, or \$2,611 under plan. On a year-to-date basis, total income was \$363,717, or \$27,591 over plan, and expenses were \$314,650, or \$28,009 under plan. Income has exceeded expenses by \$49,067, although expenses do not include budgeted reserves which are accounted for at year-end.

It is so rewarding to see the inspired financial stewardship that is taking place in our church. The Holy Spirit is leading our brothers and sisters to give generously to the mission and ministries at St. Philip!


