Our Greeter Team is starting up again for the 11:00 service. It is an easy and effective way to Share the Love of Christ, our main mission.


Currently we are looking for two people to Greet on the 3rd Sunday of the month. You could Greet with a family member or friend!


### Advent 2023


# **Augsburg Sunday School Class**



# **Message from Finance Committee**

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

September giving was up nicely from August, but still less than our monthly budgeted amount. While we remain positive for the year, the margin is narrowing and we need to finish the year strong.

For the month, total income was \$41,460 or \$8,855 under plan, and expenses were \$44,241, or just \$147 under plan. On a year-to-date basis, total income was \$442,097, or \$8,217 over plan, and expenses were \$397,700, or \$33,735 under plan. Income has exceeded expenses by \$44,397, although expenses do not include budgeted reserves which are accounted for at year-end.

It is pleasing to note that most families that submitted Estimates of Giving are right on schedule or even ahead on a year-to-date basis. A few have already met or exceeded their annual pledged amount. This is awesome and much appreciated. Since we are now into the last three months of the year, we ask that everyone take a look at what your giving has been so far and, if able, to complete the estimated amount by year end.

As always, thank you for your continued generosity in support of our ministries at St. Philip. We have been truly blessed with inspired giving.


