#### **Pastor's Message**

One of the things I have historically liked about the month of February is that it celebrates excellence in our American culture. It used to be the Grammys, the Super Bowl, the NBA All-Star Weekend, and the Oscars were aired in consecutive weeks in February (often in that order). So we were treated to excellence in music, pro football, pro basketball, and filmmaking. Lately, the Oscars have been pushed into March, a couple weeks removed from the others. And now that I'm older, the Grammys no longer have the same appeal to me as they once did, though I still try to tune in. (I may be turning into somewhat of a grumpy old man: "you call THAT music?" For the first time ever, I'm going to write in a newsletter article..."LOL!"

St. Paul writes to the Philippians, "Finally, beloved, whatever is true, whatever is honorable, whatever is just, whatever is pure, whatever is pleasing, whatever is commendable, if there is any EXCELLENCE and if there is anything worthy of praise, think about these things" (4:8) (emphasis mine). Of course, St. Paul is not talking about excellence in cultural matters; he would not even have been aware of such subsequent concepts as professional sports or cinema. Rather, here he is speaking of spiritual matters. Excellence is defined as "the quality of being outstanding or extremely good"; it comes from the Latin word meaning "surpass."

Love is an excellent thing, for example. When St. Paul writes to the Corinthians his famous passage concerning love in chapter 13 of his first letter, he prefaces it by declaring, "I will show you a still more EXCELLENT way" (12:31) (again, emphasis mine).

February is also the traditional month of love, as we celebrate Valentine's Day on the 14th. This is a secular holiday, which once had its roots in the Christian faith. Regardless – and despite the rampant consumerism

which now surrounds it – it is still an opportunity to recognize and celebrate the excellent gift of love. This year, February 14th happens to be Ash Wednesday, which serves as the beginning of the season of Lent. Lent is a 40-day season of repentance and contrition prior to Easter. It presents an EXCELLENT opportunity for introspection, deepened prayer, fasting, almsgiving, sacrifice, and works of love.

This year, we are offering you Wednesday evening Taizé worship services at 6:30pm in our sanctuary (except for Holy Week) and a daily devotional entitled "Gathered into One" which will be available soon. We will likely also have an opportunity to contribute to a meaningful gift to our local Camp Agape, though details are still being worked out as of this writing.

The winner of this month's Super Bowl will lift the prized Lombardi trophy. It is named after legendary Green Bay Packers coach, Vince Lombardi, who once told his team, "Gentleman, we will chase perfection, and we will chase it relentlessly, knowing all the while we can never attain it. But along the way, we shall catch excellence." We do not chase perfection here, but because of the Holy Spirit, we have accomplished some excellent things as of late. Just today I discovered that, among other things, last month's average worship attendance (168 people) was the highest in the four years I've been here. So thank you for valuing worship and taking it seriously as a part of your discipleship – and for continuing to invite people to visit.

People of God, siblings in Christ, members of St. Philip: you are an excellent people. Because you have an excellent God. Continue, in Lent, to "think about excellent things." And to take advantage of the excellent opportunities we have here in this holy season.

# Worship Services with the Imposition of Ashes Wednesday, February 14th

1:00 pm & 7:00 pm.

Ash Wednesday is the Wednesday of the seventh week before Easter and the first day of Lent. The day is named for the practice of imposing ashes, a practice that many Lutheran congregations have found to be a very meaningful part of the Ash Wednesday liturgy.


Using ashes as a sign of repentance is an ancient practice, often mentioned in the Bible (e.g., Jonah 3:5-9; Job 42:6; Jeremiah 6:26; Matthew 11:21). The early Christians adopted the use of ashes from Jewish practice as an external mark of penitence. ~ELCA

#### Gathered into One: Devotions for Lent 2024 by Yolanda Denson-Byers

Join the Church-Wide Lenten use of devotions as we recall the time Christ spent, shortly before the beginning of his public ministry overcoming temptation, (on our behalf), in the wilderness.

Gathered into One provides daily devotions for each day from Ash Wednesday to the Resurrection of Our Lord. Devotions begin with an evocative image and a brief passage from First Corinthians. The writers then bring their diverse voices and pastoral wisdom to the texts with quotations to ponder, reflections, and prayers.

Portions of First Corinthians appear in the Revised Common Lectionary during each lectionary year. The apostle Paul writes this letter to the church in Corinth after hearing of quarreling and divisions among the people. He teaches the Corinthians that each person has a unique set of gifts from the Holy Spirit, given for the common good, and reminds them that the church is the body of Christ, joined together with one bread, one cup, one baptism, one God, and one Spirit. This theme of unity amid diversity is as timely now as it was when Paul wrote to the Corinthians.

It could not be easier! No training necessary.




# **Adult Book Club** Everyone is welcome!

That's the motto of Stephen Ministry. The Stephen Minister's role is to bring God's love into the lives


of people who are going through a time of transition or experiencing a crisis.

# **Message from Finance Committee**

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Let's take a moment to reflect on our financial results for 2023 as we embark on this new year.

Total income for the year was \$591,617, or \$14,243 better than plan and up more than \$47,000 over the previous year. Expenses were \$560,442, or \$16,928 under plan, after funding all budgeted reserves. Income exceeded expenses by \$31,171 which bolstered our general reserves. It is worthy of note that in addition to exceeding our total income plan for the year, at the time of this writing members had also generously contributed enough to cover most of the cost of our new security system.

So, thanks to all of you and praise God for another year of blessings as we expanded our ministries and outreach. Even greater opportunities for growth are coming our way in 2024 as evidenced by the budget approved by the Congregation in December. With your continued commitment and God's help, we will rise to our calling.
