

Pastor's Message

Welcome to Fall! At least it's close enough. Many of you have been travelling throughout the summer, and it will be good to have you back in person. I suspect I am not alone in eagerly anticipating the cooler temperatures the new season will bring. We look forward to resuming many ministry activities which took a hiatus over the summer.

First and foremost on my mind is the resumption of Bible Study! Bible Study will begin on Wednesday, September 11, at 10:30 am and 6:45 pm, in the Music Room. Although we strongly encourage inperson attendance, we will also offer a Zoom option. Last year our topic was "the Basics of the Christian Faith." We studied (in order) the 10 Commandments, the 8 Beatitudes, The Lord's Prayer, Prayer (more generally and broadly), Belief (and early creedal statements), The Apostle's and Nicene Creeds, Baptism, Holy Communion, the organization of Scripture, Theology (and the three basic creeds of Trinitarianism, Christology, and Soteriology/ Salvation), Christian History (and its three major schisms), and Worship. It was a compelling study with high attendance and thoughtful, provocative discussion.

We are not finished yet, however. So our topic will be again "The Basics of the Christian Faith," and we will simply pick back up where we left off. Our remaining sub-topics will include the Great Commandment, the Great Commission, the Holy Spirit (the fruit and gifts of), Faith, Tithing, Preaching, Sabbath, Healing, Justice, Transformation, and Music.

We anticipate continued high attendance and spirited conversation.

One of the appeals of a topical study (as opposed to working your way through a particular biblical book, for example) is that you are free to drop in and out as you choose, since each sub-topic doesn't necessarily build on the others. We hope you will join us for another exciting year of studying the Word of God!

I would also like to invite you to our annual "God's Work. Our Hands" Sunday on September 29th. GWOH Sunday is a day of service across our national denomination, the ELCA.

On this day, we will have just one worship service, a "United" service at 10 am, followed by a potluck lunch in Luther Hall around 11:15 or so, followed by several options for service. Please see further details of the service opportunities and potluck lunch in this newsletter. This annual Sunday is an excellent opportunity to worship, break bread, and serve together across our two worshipping communities. We look forward to seeing you there!

Finally, the Pub Ministry is sponsoring our North Raleigh Ministries (NRM) annual Food Drive this month. Please give selflessly and sacrificially, as we assist hungry families in our nearby communities. You may purchase food from the lists circulating around and/or contribute money online or via check. St. Philip Fall Food Drive for North Raleigh Ministries— Through the month of September.

This September St. Philip is doing a Food Collection Drive to support the NRM Food Panty. In 2023 the NRM Food Pantry served nearly 900 people a month in North Raleigh who needed food support. This year they on track to serve over 2,000 people a month, nearing 20,000 people this year. As they seek to help alleviate rising food insecurity in our community the following items are needed, especially as NRM officially opens a new Crisis & Development Center that includes a newer and larger space for their food pantry so that they can continue to serve more in need.


Youthquake Day Retreat (grades 3-5) Oct. 5


Youthquake is a synod-wide gathering for 3rd-5th grade from across NC for fellowship, learning, service, and worship.



A New Ministry—A Gathering of Grievers

Are you grieving the loss of a loved one? Are you grieving the loss of a dream...as in a divorce? Loss of a pet? Loss and grief don't just come from the loss of a loved one, there are feelings of grief with any "big" change in your life. This can include loss of a job, loss of a friendship, moving to a new area and starting over, or your child "leaving the nest."

Most of us were not taught how to deal with losses. Well meaning people tell us things like "Time heals all wounds" and "You're young, you can re-marry/have another child/find another job." These intellectual suggestions don't help us to heal from our losses. But, a caring Christian Community that offers a chance to learn from and support each other CAN help us heal from our losses.

This is a SAFE PLACE to share your feelings-no judgment- so we can all heal from our grief and losses. This is a time to be with others who understand the weight of grief. I personally have learned so much over the last year since I lost the love of my life, my husband Chuck, to cancer. Everyone experiences their grief differently, so what works for me may not work for you, but sometimes it just helps to have someone who is in the same boat to listen to you and share their story.

The plan is to have a brief introduction followed by a discussion about the vision of this group. How can we support each other? How often do we want to meet? Monthly? The intent is to share our experience, strength and hope with each other, knowing we cannot "fix" this for each other. We can share what helps us most day to day dealing with our losses, such as books, podcasts, activities, and daily practices such as journaling. This group is intended to be an INFORMAL gathering of grievers, this is NOT intended to be individual or group counseling.

Message from Finance Committee

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

While income was up in July compared to June, it still remained well under plan for the month. As a result, we fell further behind in general fund giving compared to our budget.

For the month, total income was \$44,838, or \$7,762 under plan and expenses were \$44,609, or \$10,942 under plan. On a year-to-date basis, total income was \$316,733, or \$52,017 under plan, while expenses were \$339,166, or \$28,435 under plan. Expenses have exceeded income by 22,433.

We wish to say again that while we are significantly behind our plan for total income, we are so thankful for your incredible generosity. Although behind plan this year, the growth in general fund giving has been outstanding over the last several years and our families have graciously funded projects and ministries outside of the budget such as the security system. Nevertheless, a shortfall is looming this year, about which we plan to share more details with you at both services one Sunday in September.

We thank God for you and your commitment to St. Philip and its ministries.
