Pastor's Message

October is always Stewardship season for us here at St. Philip. This year, our theme is "Moving Forward Together," and we have an exciting kick-off for you this Sunday. After a few weeks of prayer and reflection, our "Commitment Sunday" will be on October 20, when we will ask for your Estimate of Giving cards (otherwise known as pledges) to be turned in.

To begin with, I would like to thank you all for your faithful and generous financial giving this year. We are slightly ahead of schedule as it concerns our pledged income for this year, and that is almost unheard of, so I call that to your attention so that we may celebrate that fact.

On top of that, you have responded in an extraordinary manner to our Families Together spring campaign, our Camp Agape fundraiser, our Back to School supply drive, and finally, our Pub Ministry-sponsored food drive for North Raleigh Ministries. Because of your abundant and sacrificial giving, homeless families now have homes, summer campers will soon have a pool in which to swim, students in need have all their necessary supplies, and hungry people have been fed. We are an amazing group of disciples here who joyfully respond to the needs of our community and God's Kingdom.

Because we adopted an aggressive budget this year, however, we are still behind in necessary funds. Our expenses have exceeded our income so far. If you are able to increase your giving to our ministry here, we would please ask you to consider doing so. The vital work of our mission continues.

As many of you know, I have served small congregations in economically challenged areas for years. Resources in those places were stretched thin, to say the least, and oftentimes the ministries barely survived. I was reminded of that reality recently when I saw a post of a pastoral colleague and friend in Philadelphia concerning his church. It read, "Relief is here! Perspire no more, for our air conditioning has been successfully repaired. Although we might not need it for too much longer this season, it's good to know that things are working properly. Unfortunately, there's been a cost --\$7,000 to be exact. We used funds from our reserves for the cost of this repair, but this has made our financial cushion uncomfortably thin. It will be necessary to replace the funds we've spent, so we hope all our members will consider pitching in by making a special donation to help replenish our reserves and getting us back on sound financial footing." Can you imagine having to go to your reserves for a cost of \$7,000? And then having that mere amount represent a threat to your financial viability and very existence? I remember those (not so far off) days well and thank God that I have been spoiled by comparison over the past five years to serve a church with over a half million-dollar budget and healthy reserves. I say all that to remind ourselves how blessed we are here at St. Philip in so many ways, including ample financial resources.

Let us **Move Forward Together** in faith and discipleship.

Let us **Move Forward Together** in Word and Sacrament.

Let us **Move Forward Together** in love and fellowship. Let us **Move Forward Together** in thanksgiving and prayer.

Let us **Move Forward Together** in inspiration and momentum.

This September, St. Philip did a Food Collection Drive to support the NRM Food Panty. We had an overwhelmingly positive response!

Why bother with formally uniting with a church? Being part of a faith community can be described as our opportunity to grasp hold of each other in responsibility and love.


In uniting with church you: Make visible your commitment to Christ and his people.

Message from Finance Committee

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

August was the first month this year that income met or exceeded our monthly budget, but as I outlined at each service on September 15, we are substantially behind plan for the year.

For the month, total income was \$56,286, or \$3,686 over plan while expenses were \$59,498, or \$9,198 over plan. The large overage in expenses was due to the cost of replacing an HVAC unit. In an earlier monthly period, a designated donation for HVAC replacement was recorded as a negative expense. As a result, the HVAC expense line item is within budget for the year. On a year-to-date basis, total income was \$373,020, or \$48,331 under plan, while expenses were \$398,569, or \$19,331 under plan. Expenses have exceeded income by \$25,550.

As noted during the services earlier this month, we project that we will have a significant shortfall of income compared to expenses and not be able to fund budgeted reserves this year. Hopefully, with your generosity and God's blessings, we can do better than the projections and close the gap some. We ask for your prayers for our finances as we close the year and also for wisdom and discernment as we begin the budget process for 2025 very soon.

We thank God for you and your commitment to St. Philip and its ministries.


