With the arrival of June, summer is practically upon us. Praise God for the warmer weather and the opportunity to take some time off and vacation.

Our Families Together spring campaign concludes on June 8th. Some impressive news to share: on their "triple match" day, they raised \$179,000, \$80,000 of which was contributed by the larger St. Philip family – almost half of the total! Thank you so much for your consistent generosity. We are pushing forward to our goal of \$100,000, and we are soon to be in striking distance of that. If we meet that goal, we at St. Philip will have moved 10 families (of three to five people apiece) who are experiencing homelessness to a stable and secure home. I am so excited that we can have such a tangible impact on our neighbors' lives, and I remain grateful to serve a congregation who takes to heart our mission statement to "share the love of Christ."

We are receiving five new members into the life of our St. Philip faith community on June 1st: Leslie Johnston, David Farrington, Noell Ochieng, Mitchell Miller and Janesha Hassaram. Mitchell and Janesha will be married this summer. We praise God for continuing to add to our numbers here, as well as our faithfulness and discipleship. Please make sure you introduce yourselves to our newest members. We will celebrate Rowan Kindl as a high school graduate in our Crossing service on June 1st. Rowan is graduating from Millbrook High School – Summa Cum Laude! – and will be attending Macalester College in St. Paul, MN, in the fall. We are so proud of them and are excited to see them flourish over the next four years. Also, Joseph Ubertini will be confirmed on Pentecost Sunday, June 8th. We are so proud of him, as well, and celebrate this occasion with his family. Job well done, Rowan and Joseph!

Finally, please remember that we will have one United worship service on the fifth Sunday of this month, June 29th, at 10am. Following worship, our own Dave's Pub Ministry will be cooking on the grill, as we eat lunch and fellowship together. We look forward to seeing you then and there!

Outreach Highlights



St. Philip - A faith community that helps families find homes

Each spring Families Together (FT) holds their Spring Fundraising Campaign to help families in Wake County who are experiencing homelessness find a stable homing situation. Their holistic approach towards helping to move families experiencing crisis into stable situations is vitally important and has a real impact on our community.

FAMILIES TOGETHER

While our support for this year's Spring Fundraising Campaign comes to a close on Sunday, a PLM organization June 8, it seems clear that St. Philip has made part of its identity—being a church that keeps families together and helps them find homes. So far this year (as of the writing of this article) we have

successfully raised over \$92,000 towards our \$100,000 goal with a few weeks left go!

Since Families Together (FT) was founded as Pan Lutheran Ministries (PLM) 45 years ago, St. Philip has helped an estimated 400 families (~1,100 people) move from experiencing homelessness into secure homes.

That is incredible! We give thanks for this congregation's generosity of spirit, time, energy, finances, and gifts and for the incredible impact we've had over the years through this wonderful organization.


Adult Book Club

Message from the Finance Committee

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

I am pleased to report that giving April giving was slightly above plan, although we remain behind plan for the year.

For the month, our income was \$53,472, or \$503 over plan, while expenses were \$57,684, or \$410 under plan. On a year-to-date basis, income was \$199.828, or \$13,447 under plan, and expenses were \$217,532, or 158 over plan. Expenses have exceeded income by \$17,705 so far this year.

In our message in last month's Epistle I shared with you that we have experienced a meaningful drop in giving each May for a number of years. As of this writing, I don't have the results for May 2025, but wish to express my appreciation to anyone who gave a bit extra to help overcome this perplexing trend.

Thank you for all you do to support the ministries at St. Philip!
